Sewer Committee September 11, 2023

It was advised to the Committee that the parish sewer systems are in financial stress. Louisiana Rural Water will perform a rate study to see what it would take to make the systems solvent again. No action will be taken at this time.

In regards to delinquent sewer accounts, the Jury will also need to proceed with a user audit, in order to identify the homes of customers who are not paying. This will allow the Jury to obtain a count of how many residents are delinquent. Once the audit is complete, then the Jury can move forward with submitting letters notifying the customers of past due accounts with action to be taken if not done in a timely manner.
